To Our Residents and Family Members:

This week, the Mid-Hudson region entered Phase 3 of reopening, and the total number of New Yorkers testing positive for COVID-19, as well as virus-related hospitalizations, declined again. Our State is making good progress, and everyone needs to do their part to enable that trend to continue by adhering to social distancing recommendations and wearing a mask in public.

Since our last update, there have been NO new positive cases in our LCC resident population. Our one positive resident is now negative and has been cleared to leave our COVID-19 area as of today. Currently there are no COVID-19 positive residents. We had two new staff person testing positive this week, and they self-isolating at home, per NYS DOH guidelines. LCC has had no COVID-19 related deaths to date.

Our Father's Day celebration was enjoyed by all last week, and we have begun preparations for our July 4 holiday observance. Some of our planned activities will include "Firecracker Bingo" and some special holiday snacks for our residents! As usual, please wear your mask, and no contact is permitted with the residents during window visits.
